SIGNING A MOU WITH INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE OF ADVANCED EDUCATION, AUSTRALIA (ICAE)







On September 29, a MoU signing ceremony between NTU and ICAE was held at NTU. The Rector of NTU – Assoc. Prof. Trang Si Trung, CEO of ICAE - Mr. Sean Mahoney, Director of Northern Territory Chamber of Commerce - Mr. Brian Gallangher were in attendance.

ccording to the MoU, the two parties will cooperate in training, research and student/faculty exchange. In particular, we (NTU) are considering launching a joint program on tourism, hospitality with ICAE.

It the ceremony, the representatives from ICAE and Northern Territory Chamber of Commerce had a discussion with students and faculty members about the education, the requirements, and the study environment in Northern Australia as well as the availability of hospitality programs at ICAE.

INTERNATIONAL SEAFOOD TRADE FORUM 2017

On August 30, within the framework of the VIETFISH FAIR 2017, NTU and the Korean Marine Institute (KMI) co-organized the international seafood trade forum 2017 (ISTF 2017) at Saigon Exhibition and Conference Center (SECC). Over 100 officials, lecturers, researchers and businessmen attended.

Tithin the topic "Promoting the seafood trade between Vietnam and Korea", the participants listened to presentations on the status of Vietnam's fisheries trade and direction of cooperation between the two countries, as well as expanding seafood exports from Vietnam to Korea and other markets; the structure of seafood trade between Korea and ASEAN and cooperation expansion strategy; business cooperation between Vietnam and Korea in

the seafood sector; corporate social responsibility in global supply chain governance; and direction of expanding seafood exports from Korea and Vietnam to the world.

I addition, NTU signed a MoU with KMI, ISTF and Vietnam Association of Seafood Exporters and Producers (VASEP). Regarding the MoU, the parties will cooperate in the academic field by organizing and participating in each other's seminars, conducting joint-research activities, sharing academic materials, and in the networking field by providing and exchanging information in the fisheries sector to facilitate trade and investment opportunities.



ANNUAL GOVERNANCE COUNCIL MEETING OF THE ILP AND THE INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON FISHERIES FOR THE FUTURE GENERATION

In September and October 2017 (21-26/9 and 16-17/10), Dr. Nguyen Thi Ngan - Deputy Director of External Cooperation Department, NTU attended the annual Governance Council (GC) meeting of the ILP and participated in the International Symposium on Fisheries for the Future Generation held at Tokyo University of Marine Science and Technology by invitation from Kagoshima University.

The meeting reviewed activities taking place in the academic year 2016-2017 among partner universities and discussed plans for the academic year 2017-2018. In 2016-2017, 21 students participated in the exchange programs (17 from NTU, Terengganu University, Sam Ratulangi University, University of Philippines Visayas, Kasetsart University; and 3 students from Kagoshima University). The Governance Council approved certificates of completion for 13 students who completed the requirements of the program according to the Common Rule of the ILP.

Iso within the framework of the ILP collaboration, partners participated in the International Symposium on Fisheries for Future Generation. Dr. Nguyen Thi Ngan gave a presentation on the international cooperation in research and training at NTU in the field of fisheries. This was also an opportunity for NTU to update the activities within the framework of the ILP program, share experience in management, training, and research, and broaden cooperation with other universities.

ENHANCING COOPERATION WITH KAGOSHIMA UNIVERSITY, JAPAN

Four exchange students at Kagoshima University



Tithin the international linkage program on tropical fisheries (ILP), four students from NTU attended a short term program at Kagoshima University, Japan from August 19 to September 27.

These students took courses in aquaculture, tropical fishery management, modern analytical and experimental methods. The students received JASSO's scholarships from the Japanese government worth 160.000 JPY per student. In addition, they each also received 5 million VND support from NTU.

On August 11, Dr. Khong Trung Thang, Vice Rector of NTU had a meeting with Assoc. Prof. Kazuhiki Araku from Fisheries Faculty- Kagoshima University and other Japanese companies' representatives.

Is a result, participants agreed to collaborate on a tuna evaluation and classification project based on popular classification criteria and the new K indicator criteria in Binh Dinh, Phu Yen and Khanh Hoa Provinces.

Besides the aforementioned collaboration, solutions to strengthen cooperation in training and student and faculty exchanges were discussed.



DISCUSSING COOPERATION WITH THE DELEGATION OF THE AUSTRALIAN AMBASSADOR IN VIETNAM

On October 2, Assoc. Prof. Dr Trang Si Trung – NTU Rector, along with department heads discussed the directions for strengthening cooperation with Australia with Mr. Craig Chittick - Australian Ambassador to Vietnam, and Ms. Karen Lanyon - Australian Consul General in Ho Chi Minh City.

The meeting, the two sides reviewed the results achieved in the cooperation between the University and Australian universities, organizations and territories over the years. At the conclusion of the meeting, the two sides discussed and agreed on the direction of increasing cooperation in the future through the Australian Embassy, focusing on cooperation in scientific research, technology transfer, training (starting with cooperation on the tourism program, and short courses for Australian students via the New Colombo project), and exchanges of staff, lecturers and students.



VISIT TO HYUNDAI VINASHIN SHIPYARD CO., LTD.



t the invitation of Hyundai Vinashin Shipyard Co., Ltd, a NTU delegation including representatives from Faculty of Transportation Engineering, Faculty of Foreign Language, Faculty of Accounting and Finance and Faculty of Economics visited the company on July 27.

During the meeting, both parties shared information and discussed cooperation in human resource training and conducting research. In particular, the company made commitments to receive interns and recruit graduates.

Faculty of Transportation Engineering, Hyundai Vinashin Shipyard Co., Ltd and Ulsan College (Korea) had a joint program in which Faculty of Transportation Engineering annually select from six to ten excellent 4th year students to study at Ulsan College. After graduation, the students will receive a double degree from Ulsan College and NTU and will be recruited by Hyundai Vinashin.

In September, twenty-seven pupils receiving the English Access Microscholarships began their studies at NTU. All pupils come from disadvantaged families: some are orphaned, some have mothers undergoing cancer treatments, some have parents with low or no income, etc.

The atmosphere of the first class was quite silent because of their shyness. Some introduced themselves without looking at others. However, when the class came to an end, the atmosphere was much better thanks to the painting activity based on English instructions. Through much focus and discussion, seven groups not only completed seven interesting paintings, but also overcame their shyness. The pupils became more excited; they raised their hands to share their ideas and laughed out loud as they found amusing elements in their own paintings. They even stood up, and persuaded the teacher to give them bonus points. The class ended at 19.30; several pupils wanted to stay longer.

The English Access Microscholarship **Program** of The US Department of State (Ministry of Foreign Affairs) began in 2004, and is currently deployed in 85 countries, with approximately 95,000 students from ages of 13 to 20. In Nha Trang, the program is coordinated by Nha Trang University with the US Consulate in Ho Chi Minh City and will run from September 2017 to August 2019. 27 pupils have passed the interview to attend the course for free. They also are provided with free textbooks, learning materials and a bicycle as a means of transport to the class. At the end of the course, students will receive a certificate of completion.





The English Access Microscholarship Program at NTU serves the eighth, ninth, tenth – grade pupils having difficulties in life but studying well, especially having a passion for learning English. The teachers are NTU faculties and volunteers from the US and Australia. We also invite some international students to help the pupils with group activities. Besides the textbook "American English Files," the teachers will design additional activities and materials to teach them more knowledge and skills. Beside English lessons, the pupils are also taught computer skills and participate in extra curriculum activities and field trips. With a good background in English, it is hoped that they can apply for scholarships to high schools and universities as well as other exchange programs in the US.



SHARING EXPERIENCE IN QUALITY ASSURANCE AND TESTING WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF ECONOMICS AND LAW

On August 4, leaders of NTU welcomed a delegation from the University of Economics and Law, HCMC.

It the meeting, the two universities discussed issues related to quality assurance and testing. Details are as follows:

uality assurance: methods to build databases and publish them on a website; ways to digitalize indicators for training quality evaluation; how to build and effectively use the KPI (key performance indicators) to monitor credit-based programs.

Testing: methods to build examination tests integrated with subject learning outcomes; methods of managing the faculties' examination activity; collaborative management of joint programs, examinations for part-time programs.

QUALITY ASSURANCE IN THE UNIVERSITY

EVALUATING THE QUALITY OF HIGHER EDUCATION AT NTU

The delegation inspected dossiers and evidence, visited departments, presided over a number of theoretical and practical lectures and experiments, interviewed the Party Committee, Board of Rectors, Self-Evaluation Councils, leaders of departments, faculty, staff, and students.

It the end of the inspection, Dr. Truong Chi Hien - Head of the delegation, presented a preliminary report which described the assessment based on 10 standards and 61 criteria in the whole activities of the university. In each criterion, the report clearly outlines the strengths as well as some recommendations for the university. The leader of NTU and head of the delegation eventually signed the minutes of completion.

From September 19 to 23, the delegation from the Center for Education Accreditation - National University of Ho Chi Minh City conducted an official inspection at NTU. The goal was to implement the regulation on evaluation of the quality of higher education institutions by the Ministry of Education and Training.









NETWORKING NIGHT

On the evening of September 6, NTU Youth Union and Student Union Association held a networking night to welcome 59th cohort students. Assoc. Prof.

Trang Si Trung – Rector and representatives of businesses were in attendance.

Speaking at the event, Assoc. Prof. Trang Si Trung shared about studying and practicing in the university environment. He enjoined the new students to try their best to achieve high academic results and develop ethical skills for future career.

Some seniors of the union, association, clubs and leaders of some enterprises also shared information and answered questions related to student's life and start-up experiences.

GRADUATION CEREMONIES 2017

OPENING CEREMONY FOR MASTER PROGRAM 2017

On September 17, NTU organized an opening ceremony for master programs (second batch). The Board of Rector, heads of departments, lecturers and 336 new students were in attendance.

It the opening ceremony, Dr. Quach Hoai Nam - The Vice Rector, while congratulating the new students, introduced the policies of the university's graduate training. He advised them to focus on studying and research and promised that NTU will continue to improve the facilities to serve the students.

INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOP ON THE APPLICATION OF MICROENCAPSULATION TECHNOLOGY IN FOOD, NUTRITION, AQUACULTURE AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

An international workshop entitled "Application of Microencapsulation Technology in Food, Nutrition, Aquaculture and Animal Husbandry" was held at NTU from July 6 to 7. More than 100 delegates from the Ministry of Education and Training, Vietnam Academy of Science and Technology, and fifteen Vietnamese and foreign universities and research institutes attended.

It the workshop, 16 reports on new findings in the applications of microencapsulation technology were presented, including application of microencapsulation technology in food processing for fish larvae; application of microencapsulation technology containing bioactive compounds that are biologically active in food production; and the antioxidant properties of ergothioneine from edible mushrooms and their applications in aquatic products.

It is evident that microencapsulation technology is increasingly applied in many areas of life. In the world, especially in Europe and the US, microencapsulation technology is developed and applied in the fields of printing, textiles, agriculture, pharmaceuticals, etc.

The workshop contributed to creating a forum for scientists and businesses to share and exchange research findings and application of microencapsulation technology in all fields, as well as seeking cooperation opportunities in the future.



WORKSHOP ON SHRIMP DISEASES AND SOLUTIONS

In order to evaluate the current status of diseases in shrimp and develop effective treatment solutions, NTU held a workshop on shrimp disease and solutions on July 5. Over 100 delegates from the governmental aquaculture authorities, fishery enterprises operating in breeding production and veterinary medicine, researchers from NTU, Research Institute for Aquaculture No. 3, Nha Trang Institute of Oceanography, and representatives of shrimp farmers in the area attended.

15 presentations at the workshop focused on the following topics:

- * **Diseases in shrimp:** Disease situations in shrimp farming; overview of the hepatopancreas in shrimp; disease status in shrimp in Khanh Hoa; H2S the silent killer; world shrimp production and emerging diseases.
- * **Solutions:** Use of stimulants in shrimp farming; Some measures to reduce premature death syndrome and white feces diseases in white

shrimp in industrial shrimp culturing; Use of additives substituting for antibiotics in disease prevention and treatment in white shrimp; Some substitutes for antibiotics in aquaculture; Tactics to develop product to increase resistance and health for shrimp.

* **Some models for safe shrimp culturing:** biofloc technology - based model; The process of disease-free shrimp production of Viet Uc's company.



TUNA CLASSIFICATION ACCORDING TO WEIGHT

On June 30, the Department of Science and Technology of Khanh Hoa organized an assessment for acceptance of the experimental project: "Design and manufacture of a system for tuna classification according to weight for seafood processing plants" conducted by the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, NTU according to the orders of Vietnam Tuna Co., Ltd.

1 researchers, many companies in the world currently are producing bales. However, products are manufactured with many uses; customers can order them with different configurations but high prices.

ased on these requirements, the research Betam of the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, Nha Trang University (headed by Dr. Nguyen Van Tuong) have successfully researched, designed and manufactured the weighing system. The system consists of four conveyor belts and a common control system. The fish are transported to the input conveyor belt and transported to the acceleration conveyor belt at the speed of the weighing conveyor belt. Each fish will pass through these conveyor belts and the weighing process will be continuously automatic. Once weighed, the fish will be moved to the classification conveyor belt to be classified into eight different sizes (quantities of the size required by the company), then depending on the weight, the fish will be automatically placed into one of the eight baskets arranged side by side at the end of the conveyor belt. The results showed that with fish weighing up to 15 kilograms, the yield was 10 tons/hour (03 units / sec), with an error rate less than 100g. After classification, the fish will be transferred to the next processing stage. Materials for constructing the system are hygienic and safe, allowing the storage and retrieval of data on the spot and warning when encountering any problems.

The results of the project were highly appreciated by the evaluation committee of the Khanh Hoa Department of Science and Technology. They concluded that the research team has created new equipment that can be widely applied in the food processing industry.

This was the first time Japan Culture Day was organized in Khanh Hoa. The event is a special cultural occasion for staff and students to experience Japanese culture.






NTU HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS/ FACULTIES INAUGURATION CEREMONY


Eligibility for Chevening scholarship is as follows: staff and students having Bachelor degrees in the same major as the Master's program, having worked full-time or part-time for two years, having never received a UK government scholarship, and committing to return to Vietnam for a minimum of two years after program completion.

According to data collected from the Web of Science (WoS) on ISI journals from Vietnam, published by Tien Phong Newspaper, NTU is in the top 20 Vietnamese universities having the highest international ISI publications in the first 6 months of 2017. Specifically, NTU had 18 ISI journals and ranked 17th.

Research publication in international journals in general, and ISI journals in particular, is one of the important criteria for evaluating and ranking higher education institutions. The researchers of NTU have been promoting research and actively publishing new research in prestigious national and international journals. The data above clearly reflects NTU's development policy to become a respected university in the region and the world.

The ISI Catalogue includes 14,000 top scientific journals indexed by Clarivate (USA); Meanwhile, Scopus (Netherlands) is another database of about 23,000 leading scientific journals in the world. Most ISI journals are also Scopus ones. As a result, the scientific community often uses statistical results from ISI journals to assess the capacity of researchers and institutions.
